Patient Assessment & Care	Collects comprehensive clinical data from patients (medical history, symptoms, physical findings)
	Records and reports patient symptoms and outcomes
	Treatment response evaluation
	Personal care Identifies patient goals and modifies care plans
Direct Care & Treatment	Administers medications and prescribed treatments
	Educates patients on self-care management
	Provides individual therapies for cognitive or behavioral disorders
	Treatment plan implementation
Documentation & Communication	Communicates with multidisciplinary healthcare units
	Maintains accurate and detailed patient records
	Supervises nursing staff and assistants
