

Nurse Practitioner

Nurse practitioners (NPs) are licensed independent practitioners responsible for managing health problems and coordinating health care for the perioperative patient in accordance with state and federal rules and regulations and the nursing standards of care, including the assessment of health status, diagnosis, development of a plan of care and treatment, implementation of the treatment plan, and evaluation of patient status.
